



HOPE Services is losing well over \$600,000 annually due to the loss of Tangible Personal Property Tax (business tax). HOPE Services will have lost over 3.5 million dollars by 2020. This loss has significantly impacted our ability to provide services.

The Early Intervention Program provides services for infants and toddlers, birth to three years of age, with documented delays in developmental milestones. Our Developmental Specialists collaborate with Help Me Grow Service Coordinators, employees of the Health Department, to evaluate and determine eligibility for special education services and assess for program planning.

Beginning in May 2012, the practice of providing services in the natural environment of the child and family became our focus through the Primary Service Provider model. We strive to provide the child and family services in their natural environment. Our Developmental Specialists have an abundance of expertise in early childhood special education as well as

disability categories and experience in locating appropriate therapies based on a child's needs. Once a child is eligible for services, program planning may include related services which provide modifications, adaptations and activities specific to each child's Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP). HOPE Services contracts for specialized services of occupational therapy, physical therapy and speech and language therapies. Coordinated services of the team approach guarantees individualized attention specific to the child and family's needs.

Location of services is also very individualized per family need. We make every effort to accommodate family's needs by providing services in an environment that is acceptable to them; this could be their home, a babysitter's home, library, park, HOPE Services buildings or the child's local school district building. Developmental Specialists utilize the home environment as much as is plausible by the family's needs. Providing services in the local school building is beneficial



in many regards, especially as the child approaches his/her third birthday in preparation for transition from early intervention to preschool programming. As a child's third birthday approaches, the family's Service Coordinator as well as the Early Intervention Specialist will assist the family as much as they want when planning for their child's next environment. Various people will come and go out of a child's life when there are medical or developmental concerns but these people will remain stable and can assist with preschool program planning. When a child turns three, he/she "graduates" out of early intervention; the IFSP that was family focused then becomes child focused with an IEP (Individualized Education Plan).

PRESCHOOL AND SCHOOL AGE

After the 2011-2012 school year, the preschool classrooms that were housed in HOPE School were transferred to NwOESC and dispersed to the local schools. There are currently two preschool units in Napoleon and one each at Patrick Henry, Liberty Center and Holgate.

SSAs have developed relationships with families at the preschool levels and continue to build trusting relationships and follow them through school age years so that when transition time comes, SSAs are able to offer and suggest specialized opportunities for individuals' likes and differences.

Transition services for the school age population begins at age 14, preparing youth for their high school and post high school years. HOPE Services also funds summer youth employment.

HOPE Services employees are still active in the lives of qualifying students in advocating, accessing and coordinating services of choice.



TRANSPORTATION

HOPE Services provides funding to the Henry County Transportation Network, adult day programs and residential providers for year-round transportation to meet the individual's needs. This includes, but is not limited to community employment, medical appointments and recreational activities.





The Board was created by Ohio Law in 1967 to provide services to individuals with intellectual disabilities or other developmental disabilities. The name of the Board was changed in law from the Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities (MRDD) to the Board of Developmental Disabilities in 2009.

It is composed of:

- Five members appointed by the County Commissioners.
- Two members appointed by the Probate Judge.
- At least three members must be parents or family members of individuals receiving or eligible for the services provided by the Board. Board members receive no compensation and volunteer their services.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

The goal of this program is to enable people with disabilities to access and succeed in competitive employment in their community. Supported Employment Services assists individuals in individual job development, job matching, job coaching, on-going follow-up services, vocational training, CPR/First Aid, money skills and driver training.

SES and the individuals just started off the New Year with their first Job Club Meeting. At the meeting, the individuals voted on which rules and regulations to keep and discard, as well as ideas on what kinds of jobs they would like to learn more about. They came up with many great ideas and are excited to see what is to come in 2016. They also reviewed their goals from last year and created new goals to achieve for this coming year. Before they left, they ended the night with a tasty snack.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Supported Employment Service (SES) of HOPE Services is a dedicated department of people that assist the individuals we work with seek, and remain successful in their employment. We could not do this without all the support and assistance that the area businesses give. We work closely with several area businesses and appreciate the patience, guidance and opportunities that they offer.



Community employment for individuals with a developmental disability has been possible thanks to the businesses who understand that everyone can contribute to the workforce, and that hiring people with disabilities is good for their bottom line. Here are just some employers in our area who have made a commitment to hiring people with disabilities: Wal-Mart, Chief, Big Boy, Big G's, Triple Diamond Plastics, Keller Logistics, Holiday Inn Express, Meijer, McDonald's, Northwest State Community College, Lowe's and Bob Evans. These businesses experience an inclusive work force that boosts productivity and production. The individuals that they employ have proven, for the most part to be dedicated, conscientious and productive workers. Their attendance and retention are often above average.

SES is currently assisting 20 individuals that are looking for a job opportunity in the area. The types of jobs that they are seeking are very diverse from full time production jobs to a very part time cleaning position. SENIOR AND ADULT SUPPORT SERVICES

Senior and Adult Support Services enhances the quality of life for adults, including seniors, who have developmental disabilities. SASS focuses on enabling the individual to attain or maintain their optimal functioning level. The services include health and nutrition, leisure skills, self-determination, physical fitness, socialization opportunities and volunteer activities. HOPE Services provides funding for individuals to work at five other adult service facilities because it's their choice on where to work and we honor their decisions.

SERVICE AND SUPPORT ADMINISTRATION

Service and Support Administrators focus on supporting, empowering and advocating for individuals with developmental disabilities and their families in their pursuit of life-long goals.

SSAs assist in accessing and coordinating desired and needed services involving financial, educational, vocational, residential and other community based programs.

The SSA assists in ALL life aspects. SSAs coordinate for the unique needs of over 400 individuals.

Voices of HOPE is a self-advocacy group who meets every four to six weeks. Peer leaders, their supports and recently elected group officials meet twice a month to plan the meeting agenda. We have had many successful Voices of HOPE meetings that include topics/lessons like:

- Knowing your rights and responsibilities
- How to deal with bullying
- Right way/wrong way to handle difficult situations
- Personal strengths and weaknesses
- Creating bucket lists and dream catchers

Future goals for the Voices of HOPE group include fundraising to help support the group financially, engage in public speaking and completing a full Project STIR training for those interested.


