### **EARLY INTERVENTION**



Written directly from the mother's perspective . . .

My name is Kelley Taormina. I have a son, Domanick, that is now four years old and is receiving services through HOPE Services. Domanick was almost two when he was diagnosed with autism.

At the time Domanick did not make eye contact with you, did not like to be touched, was a very picky eater, and did not talk. It was hard to find out that he had Autism; I was going into a world I knew nothing about.

With the assistance of Help Me Grow and HOPE Services and a lot of hard work, Domanick now talks and loves hugs. People who do not know him would never think he has autism. He goes to a preschool for kids with autism, but next year we are thinking of putting him in regular school. He still is a picky eater and has a hard time with big groups of people. Everyday it gets a little better. Domanick is funny and when he laughs it fills the room. Before he could talk, he was so unhappy all the time. It was because we didn't understand him; he knew what he wanted to say, but he just couldn't find the words. I'm so grateful for the help and support of Help Me Grow. They will always be a part of our family. I just want to say to any families that are just starting to deal with a child with autism to never give up. I would not change Domanick, he is the most kind and loving person I know. He is also very smart.

Sometimes it just take some extra work to get there. My husband and I are big believers in lots of speech and occupational therapy and the Play Project. The Play Project did wonders for Domanick. I'm not going to say there will not be set backs; the best thing I can say is stay strong and keep fighting.


### A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT



### **SENIOR AND ADULT SUPPORT SERVICES**

On the first Thursday of the month SASS individuals and a staff member travel to the Henry County Senior Center to have lunch and then call Bingo and award prizes. We continue to reach out into our community by way of our volunteer work each month. This usually includes assembling, folding, sealing and labeling monthly newsletters for organizations such as the Moose Lodge, United Way and Emanuel Lutheran Church. A small group of individuals traveled to St. Paul Lutheran Church to meet with our 3<sup>rd</sup> grade pen pals. We shared stories from Christmas and the New Year and played a game. Everyone parted with smiles and prizes! We also traveled to St. John Lutheran School to meet with our newest pen pals from the Kindergarten, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade classes combined. Like we have with St. Paul, each month we take turns planning and engaging in an activity which then presents opportunities to both educate and build long-lasting positive relationships. A small group of SASS women went shopping and had lunch together on Ladies' Day and the guys of SASS traveled to Maumee on Man Day to have lunch and check out a movie at Fallen Timbers Cinemas. We traveled to the Filling Home gymnasium to participate in sports games led by Randy and Sarah and again to go swimming in their pool. To help remain healthy and active we also incorporated fun and fitness into our activities throughout the month here at SASS. We danced to music, participated in group chair exercises, parachute games, balloon volleyball and walking. #### **OHIO'S SYSTEM IS UNIQUE**

- Funds are raised and services are managed at the county level, not the state, to provide better program integration into the communities that we serve.
- It supports and serves more than 90,000 children and adults.
- Life-long support includes cost-effective funding of services such as: preschool, early intervention, and K-12 school-age services, residential support and employment, plus advocacy and education to support a person's integration into the community.

#### **CRITICAL NEEDS CONTINUE**

Despite federally-mandated changes in the way some services are provided, the mission and purpose of Ohio's county boards remains intact. County boards will continue to offer vital supports and resources to Ohioans with developmental disabilities and their families.

#### WE REMAIN THE SOURCE OF FUNDING

While county boards may no longer provide some direct services, we will continue to provide and allocate funding for services for people supported in our county.

#### WE SHARE A COMMON GOAL

Many of the significant changes to how the county boards support people with developmental disabilities have been driven by parents and families, who have been champions of change to ensure the fullest lives possible for their family members.

### **JOB DEVELOPMENT TIP:**

Social media is playing a larger part in how companies consider your employment. More hiring managers today are looking at applicants' social profile accounts like Facebook, Twitter and Linked In, before making hiring decisions. Employers aren't just looking for blatantly bad behavior, though. They also want to make sure you'll be a great addition to their team.

In today's competitive job market, it is important for you to stand out on paper, in person, and even online. In addition to impressive resumes and cover letters, you need to be aware of what you are sharing on these social networks. Besides avoiding negative behaviors, such as posting racy photos, there are things you can do to make yourself more appealing to potential employers.

- Do expect potential employers to scan your social profiles
- Do have a clean, professional photo
- Do show off a friendly personality
- Don't use offensive photos (anything containing nudity, alcohol, racial slurs, offensive language/signs, etc.)
- Don't speak negatively about your past or current employer
- Be selective of groups or sites that you follow


