Menolascino Award for Excellence in Psychiatric Services for DD, the Excellence in Contributions to Clinical Practice Award from the NADD and a member of Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society. She is also the recipient of the Nancy Roeske Award in Medical Education from the American Psychiatric Association.
