

Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) is disease that robs people of physical strength by affecting the motor nerve cells in the spinal cord, and impacting their ability to walk, eat, and breathe. I did not even know there was such a disability.

Because I did not know such a thing existed, I looked up what motor nerve cells were, and what I found was

most interesting.

A **neuron** is a highly specialized cell of the


nervous system that has two characteristic

properties, the ability to to be stimulated and the ability to conduct impulses. They are composed of a cell body and containing the nucleus and its surrounding cytoplasm, or the substance of a cell and one or more nerve fibers.

The nerve fibers are actually extensions of the structure surrounding the nucleus.

There are different types of neurons:

- A). Sensory neurons transmit stimuli to the brain
 - B). Motor neurons carry impulses away from from the brain to the muscles
 - C) Interneuron found in the brain and spinal

Wondering if your little one is on target with meeting his or her milestones? Here are a few to keep in mind!

At 3-5 months, baby can prop up on his forearms and lift his head and chest off the floor At 6-8 months, baby can roll from back to belly and is beginning to sit unsupported on the floor At 9-11 months, baby begins to crawl on her hands and knees and cruise along furniture At 12-15 months, baby begins to walk by himself and may creep up steps
