#### Speech and Language Milestones

Worried about your child's speech or language development? Not sure if your child's skills are on track or delayed? Speech and language skills develop in a predictable pattern. However, there is a range in skills that is considered appropriate for any given age, because all children master skills at a different pace.


Below is a list of milestones that are typical for children at the given age.

#### **Expressive Language**

Age - Approximate number of words that a child says 12 months - 6 words 15 months - 20 words 18 months - 50 words 24 months - 200-300 words 36 months (three years)– 1,000 words 42 months – 1,200 words 48 months (four years)– 1,600 words

#### **Receptive language**


Age - Approximate number of words a child understands 12 months – 84 words 16 months – 164 words 2 years - ~2400 words 3 years - ~5800 words



Speech Intelligibly Age – Intelligibility level (the percentage of time in a day a caregiver understands what the child says) 19-24 months – 25%-50% 2-3 years – 50%-75% 4-5 years – 75%-90% 5+ years – 90%-100%

## A Word From Steve Tucker, Superintendent

While it my not be official, to me, September means Fall has arrived. As hard to believe that it is Fall already, it's even harder to believe that this is our second Fall living with the COVID-19 virus.

The health and safety of those we serve is always our number one priority here at HOPE Services. Unfortunately during this pandemic, we have had one member of the HOPE Services family whose death has been attributed to COVID-19. While the loss of even one person is tragic, thanks to the very diligent work of all of our service providers here in Henry County, we have not experienced the loss of life as in other areas of the state. As of August 20, 241 people served by DD Boards across Ohio had passed away due to COVID-19 since the beginning of the pandemic.

We once again find ourselves with COVID-19 cases rising in Ohio and here in Henry County. As of August 24, the Henry County Health Department reports that, per CDC data, the current COVID-19 transmission level to be HIGH here in Henry County.

We all need to do our part to stop the spread of COVID-19. If you are not yet vaccinated, consult with your health care professional. If it is right for you, PLEASE GET THE SHOT! Remember to follow the recommended preventative measures; social distancing, stay home when sick, avoid large crowds, wash your hands, and wear a mask when appropriate!
