The same night the Henry County Cougars revealed their highly anticipated new uniforms. They were a hit. The players all look awesome sporting their Cougar uniforms





DID YOU KNOW...? Braille is a system of writing, in which a message is coded in dots symbolizing phonetic sounds embossed on cardboard, using six dots to represent each letter and number. Louis Braille was a French educator and an inventor who perfected a system of tactile code that could allow people to read and write efficiently. Inspired by the system invented by Charles Barbier, Braille constructed a new method that was more compact, lending itself to a range of uses, including music. His system of raised dots were created by using Barbier's slate and stylus tools. The system was soon extended to include Braille musical notation, and in 1929, published his first book about his system, Method of Writing Words, Music, and Plain Songs by Means of Dots, For Use by the Blind.
