

Some of the below strategies are what his family has worked on.

- Modeling words and short sentences to talk about what he is doing throughout his day.

- Giving him choices (i.e. Do you want milk or water?).
- Waiting and allowing him time to communicate.
- Expanding on what he says to encourage him to expand his vocabulary and use longer phrases.

What is a STABLE account?

A STABLE account is an investment account available to eligible individuals with disabilities. STABLE accounts allow you to save and invest money without losing eligibility for certain public benefits programs, like Medicaid or Supplemental Security Income (SSI). Earnings in your STABLE account are not subject to federal income tax, so long as you spend them on qualified disability expenses.

Still have questions?

STABLE accounts have some similar features to normal bank accounts, but they are not checking or savings accounts. STABLE accounts are investment accounts, similar to 529 college savings accounts or 401(k) retirement accounts. When you deposit money into your STABLE account, your money will be invested in different options that you choose. While you can still withdraw and spend your money whenever you need it, STABLE accounts also allow you to grow your money and to save long-term for disability expenses.

RYAN'S RESTAURANT REVIEW

Hi, this is your friend Ryan Moore with another restaurant review. I am excited to review one of Napoleon's newest restaurants,
TOP DOG!

Top Dog has a menu full of hot dog creations, with 11 different kinds of specialty hot dogs to choose from. You can also choose to build your own dog from a huge list of toppings.

So far, I have visited 3 times, and I have enjoyed 3 different choices from the menu. I give all 3 hot dogs **5 stars!** The first hot dog I tried was the Wildcat, then the Taco Dog, and then the Philly. My favorite hot dog was the Wildcat, topped with chili, bacon, nacho cheese, onions and jalapenos (I ordered it without the jalapenos). My next hot dogs to try will be the Reuben Dog, topped with corned beef, sauerkraut, Swiss cheese, 1000 Island, and then the South of the Border, with toppings of corn salsa (corn, black beans, onion, green pepper) shredded cheese, black olives and jalapenos! There are SO MANY delicious options! Top Dog will also be featuring a weekly Top Dog special, with new creations each week. On my last visit, the special was the Mac and Cheese dog. The hot dog was topped with a giant scoop of mac and cheese, plus crispy bacon and crushed tortilla chips. The hot dogs are huge, and the toppings are very generous, so you might need a fork and knife!

Top Dog also has a great salad bar, sandwiches, and sides. They will also have ice cream, floats, and milkshakes sometime soon, when Mya's Sweet Treats moves into the building. I am looking forward to getting shakes with my hotdogs! I also want to try their pulled pork sandwich cause that's one of my favorite kinds of sandwich. 

Putting Learning into Action

These three have been working hard to learn the driving laws, safety rules, road signs, and lane markings to become responsible drivers.

Being a responsible driver starts with learning this important information and continues with looking out for your safety and the safety of others.

Recently, they had the opportunity to apply what they have learned by utilizing the driving simulator at Four County Career Center.

With the guidance of Scott Palmer, Adult Education they were able to experience what it would be like behind the wheel in a parking lot and country setting in clear conditions and snow-covered roads. This training introduced them to the importance of maintaining speed control, being alert and the significance of their surroundings. Another date will be scheduled to further their experiences with stopping distance, hazards and driving in rain/snow conditions along with city driving and merging into traffic.

May is Mental Health Awareness month. In researching this topic, mental health is a general term for the range of illnesses that it encompasses. Unfortunately, mental health issues can make it difficult for someone to cope with work, relationships and other demands and stress can make mental issues worse, but most people can manage this with medication, counseling or both.

Anxiety disorders: Anxiety disorders are a group of mental health disorders that includes generalized anxiety disorders, social phobias, fear of tight spaces, obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD) and post traumatic Stress disorder (PTSD). If left untreated, anxiety disorders can lead to significant impairment on people's daily lives.

Behavioral and emotional disorders in children: Common behavior disorders in children include oppositional defiant disorder (ODD), conduct disorder (CD), and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).

Bipolar disorder: Bipolar disorder is a type of mood disorder, previously referred to as 'manic depression'. A person with bipolar disorder experiences episodes of mania (elation) and depression. This person may or may not experience psychotic symptoms. The exact cause is unknown, but a genetic predisposition has been clearly established.

Depression: Depression is a mood disorder characterized by low mood, loss of interest and enjoyment, and reduced energy. It is not just feeling sad. There are different types and symptoms of depression, as well as varying levels of severity and depression.

Obsessive-compulsive disorder: Obsessive compulsive disorder is an anxiety disorder. Obsessions are recurrent thoughts, images or impulses that are intrusive and unwanted.

Post-traumatic stress disorder: Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) is a mental health condition that can develop as a response to people who have experienced any traumatic event.

This unique opportunity provides individuals with special needs an experience to know what it's like to exhibit an animal at the fair. Participants will work with Jr. Fair Exhibitors

and their animals to participate in an alternative livestock show to share what they have learned. The animal options include: calves, sheep, goats, rabbits, and pigs. The Junior Fair exhibitors, or mentors, you will be working with will be in at least the 5th grade and have had at least two years of experience with their animal project. As a showman you will work alongside your mentor and learn how to care for the animal as well as how to safely and properly show the animal at the fair. We know that your time is valuable, but we are expecting that you are able to meet with your Shine in the Show Ring partner at the dates listed below to ensure the most positive experience for all involved.
