

Children learn how to play with others and develop important skills for learning. Children also learn to share, take turns and follow directions. These skills help children in family, community and school activities. We offer this program at no charge. This session we had 28 children enrolled. 

What is Early Intervention

What is Ohio Early Intervention?

A statewide system that provides coordinated services to parents of infants and toddlers (birth – three years) with disabilities or developmental delays in Ohio.

Who qualifies?

Any child who is under the age of three and has a State-confirmed cognitive (problem solving), socialemotional (feelings and emotions), physical (gross and fine motor), adaptive (self-help), and/or communication disability or established developmental delay is eligible for government-funded early intervention services.

What do Early Intervention Services do?

The purpose of early intervention is to lessen the effects of the disability or delay. Services are designed to identify and meet a child's needs in five developmental areas, including: physical development, cognitive development, communication, social or emotional development, and adaptive development.

What is the definition of Early Intervention?

Early Intervention means doing things as early as possible to work on your child's developmental, health and support needs. Early Intervention services give specialized support to children and families in the early years.

What is an Early Intervention Evaluation?

An evaluation (Henry County uses the Battelle Developmental Inventory) can tell whether your child is eligible for early intervention services. Anyone can refer to EI for an evaluation but parent/guardian must give consent. Children with a diagnosed disability can receive early intervention services without an evaluation. If referred, a Service Coordinator will come out to meet you and your child and explain this process along with scheduling an evaluation if needed.

Is Early Intervention Free?

Early Intervention services are provided under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). Through grants to each state from the federal government, children who qualify may receive services free of charge or at low cost.

Why is Early Intervention so Important?

The Importance of Early Intervention and Its Impact on Learning. ... During the first three years of life, children learn and develop rapidly. Things as simple as daily experiences can dramatically impact a child's learning when it comes to their cognitive, social, physical, adaptive and communication development

What is Early Intervention cont.

What does the Henry County Early Intervention Team look like?

Henry County's EI Team consists of a team of individuals who work together to provide services to each family in a Coaching and Primary Service Provider (PSP) model. Our team consist of two Service Coordinators, two Developmental Specialists, an Occupational Therapist, a Physical Therapist, a Speech Language Pathologist, a Vision Specialist, and a Hearing Specialist. The family and team will work together to decide who the best fit is for the family and child's needs that person will become the family's PSP. The PSP will come out to work with the child's caregivers on strategies to work towards the family/child outcomes. Henry County has weekly team meetings where each member can get coaching/tips/strategies from other members of our team to take back to our families. We also have a translator so that no child is left behind.

VOICES of **HOPE** SELF – ADVOCACY




