

Kawaski Awareness Day

January 26 is known as Kawaski Day. Kawaski, Also known as Mucocutaneous Lymph Node, is a rare disease that causes inflammation or swelling of the blood vessels throughout the body, most commonly effecting children. The causes are high fever and peeling of the skin.

-It is a rare disease. There are fewer than 200,000 cases in the U.S.

- -treatable by a medical professional
- -requires lab tests or imaging
- -can last several days or weeks
- -family history increases likelihood
- -effects children 5 or younger

The disease is believed to be caused due to bacteria, viruses or other environmental factors. Certain faulty genes can increase the chances of getting the disease. Japanese or Korean children are at higher risk.

Symptoms include joint pain, fever, swollen lymph nodes, a rash or the trunk, and irritability, among others.


