

Disability Has No Look: Why It's Time to Change the Way We See

When many people think of disability, they picture a wheelchair. While mobility impairments are real and valid, this narrow view excludes a wide range of disabilities that are not immediately visible. Conditions like autism, ADHD, anxiety, chronic pain, epilepsy, and many others often go unnoticed — yet they deeply affect the individuals who live with them every day. It's time to shift the narrative.

We must normalize in both the classroom and the community that *disability has no single look*. Children, teens, and adults may face challenges that aren't obvious but are just as real. By

recognizing that not all disabilities are visible, we create a more inclusive, understanding environment where everyone feels seen, supported, and valued.

Educators, peers, employers, and neighbors all play a role in shaping this inclusive mindset. It starts with compassion, continues with education, and results in a society that doesn't judge based on appearance.

Increase Independence with Assistive Technology

At HOPE Services, we are committed to enhancing the lives of individuals with developmental disabilities through innovative assistive technology. These tools are transforming communication and daily living skills. Speech-generating devices and communication apps empower individuals to express themselves and engage with their communities, fostering independence and social connections. Apps designed for task management can assist with routine activities, promoting self-sufficiency. By harnessing the power of technology, HOPE Services strives to create a more inclusive environment, instilling hope and possibility in the lives of those we serve. If you would like more information on ways assistive technology can help you or a family member become more independent, contact your SSA to explore some innovative options.

Alert: Unauthorized Agent and Broker Activity on ACA Marketplace

The Health Insurance Marketplace is seeing an increase in suspicious activity by some agents and brokers selling Marketplace coverage. This may include signing you up for coverage without your knowledge or switching you out of a plan you already have and into a new one.



What you need to know to protect yourself

- Agents and brokers **must get your permission** when signing you up or making changes to your insurance plan.
- Health insurance ads on social media or elsewhere that offer you cash, gifts, or other perks, could be a scam. Don't give out personal information that might be used without your consent.
- Use trusted, official sources to find legitimate help comparing and enrolling in Marketplace insurance. Go to "find local help" on [HealthCare.gov](https://www.healthcare.gov) or call the **Marketplace Call Center at 1-800-318-2596** to find help in your area.



What to do if you suspect changes were made on your account

- You may discover a potential problem with your coverage when you get mail or a call, or visit the doctor and try to use your insurance.
- If you believe you were enrolled in or switched to a plan without your knowledge, call the **Marketplace Call Center at 1-800-318-2596 (TTY: 1-855-889-4325)** so our official Marketplace representatives can resolve any coverage issues. Wait times are low and a representative will be able to help answer your questions.



How the Marketplace can help

If the Marketplace representatives determine you have been enrolled or had your plan switched without your knowledge, our representatives can work with your insurer and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to:

- Make sure the unauthorized plan is cancelled
- Make sure you're reenrolled in a plan that you choose
- Have inaccurate costs repaid to you
- Get corrected tax forms

Prader-Willi Syndrome

Overview

Prader-Willi (PRAH-dur VIL-e) syndrome is a rare genetic condition that leads to physical, mental and behavioral problems. A key feature of Prader-Willi syndrome is a sense of being hungry all the time.

People with Prader-Willi syndrome want to eat all the time because they never feel full. This is called hyperphagia. As a result, they usually find it hard to manage their weight. Many complications of Prader-Willi syndrome are due to obesity.

A team of different types of specialists can best manage the symptoms of Prader-Willi syndrome. The team approach to this complex condition makes complications less likely and improves quality of life.

Causes

Prader-Willi syndrome is a genetic condition that is caused by an error in one or more genes. Although it's not known exactly what causes Prader-Willi syndrome, the problem lies in the genes in a region of chromosome 15.

Sales Tax Holiday for 2025 will be held from 12:00 a.m. on August 1 until 11:59 p.m. on August 14.

Dates: August 1, 12:00 a.m. – August 14, 11:59 p.m.

Eligible Items: Almost all tangible personal property priced at \$500 or less is tax-free.

Exclusions: The following items will still be taxed:

Watercraft or outboard motors, Motor vehicles, Alcoholic beverages, Tobacco products, Vapor products, Items containing marijuana

The month kicked off with our 2025 Law Enforcement Torch Run through downtown Napoleon on June 5. Starting at 10:30 AM, local law enforcement officers, athletes, and community members ran side by side, carrying the Flame of Hope to raise awareness and support for the Special Olympics. The parade of athletes and enthusiastic supporters really highlighted the strong bond between law enforcement and the Special Olympics community.

The next week, we headed to the Special Olympics Ohio Summer Games in Columbus. This year we took a team of bowlers, the Traditional Volleyball team, three powerlifters, and the track and field team for the competition. We spent the weekend on the campus of OSU, and with a bus load of Buckeye fans, it was an awesome experience. There were almost 5,000 athletes from around Ohio that were competing. Jacob Heath was honored to carry the Flame of HOPE during the opening ceremonies on Friday night. He was part of the 3rd leg of the Torch ceremony. 
