Spinal Muscular Atrophy Awareness Month

Spinal Muscular Atrophy Awareness month takes place yearly in August. It is a hereditary neurological illness that inhibits voluntary muscle action, leading to gradual muscular weakness and atrophy; it is a condition in which the spinal cord does not form normally. This neural tube develops into the baby's brain, spinal cord and the tissues that surround it. The disease does not cause any impairments and does not manifest until later in life.

Spinal muscular atrophy is a rare neuromuscular disease that causes motor neuron loss and gradual wasting of muscles. It is typically identified in infancy or early childhood and is the leading cause of infant death. It may sometimes occur later in life, resulting in a milder version of the disease.

OUTDOOR SENSORY MOTOR PLAY IDEAS FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

*Just a quick word of caution about outdoor safety during play: always remember to scan the environment for hazardous items or situations that cause serious harm to your child and remove the danger or your child from this situation.

Play with sand or rocks:

Rocks come in all shapes in sizes. Pebbles, pea rocks, gravel, and sand are great for manipulating, holding, scooping, dumping, shoveling, digging, and collecting, which develop a child's sense of touch, hearing, and sight.

Walk barefoot on grass:

Walking and running barefoot on grass, sand, mud, or pebbles is a unique sensory experience that helps develop a child's sense of touch as well as their vestibular and proprioception senses.

Roll down a grassy slope:

This activity is a great way for developing a child's vestibular and proprioception senses. It also stimulates their sense of smell and touch.

Play with water:

Water play is a classic sensory activity. Splashing, stomping, scooping, pouring, and funneling engages all the senses. Water play outside can be fun and messy and can happen around natural bodies of water like lakes, creeks, ponds, and puddles and also in sprinklers, pools, buckets, or water tables. Safety tip: Always supervise young children near water.

Swing from a tree or monkey bars:

Hanging and swinging on a sturdy tree branch or monkey bars develops a child's vestibular and proprioception senses. Look for sturdy branches or monkey bars at parks and along trails.


Sensory play includes activities that engage young children's senses. When identifying senses, we usually think about sight, hearing, smell, taste and touch, but vestibular (movement and balance) and proprioception (body position) are also included as senses. Children rely on their senses to interpret what is going on in their world. That's why from the age of birth to five, young children are often placing things in their mouths, grabbing things, and climbing on everything. Sensory play has a crucial role in a young child's brain development. It helps young brains make new connections, strengthen pathways, and adjust unnecessary synapses. When young kids engage their senses through play, they learn important skills such as cognitive skills (developing knowledge), fine motor skills (grasping small items), gross motor skills (balancing and walking), language skills (learning words), problem-solving skills (reasoning), memory skills (remembering experiences), social skills (collaborating), and emotional regulation skills (managing and expression emotions).

Make a sensory bin from nature items

Invite your young child to make their own sensory bin by collecting things like shells, pinecones, rocks, sticks, and leaves to bring indoors. Look for items with different shapes and textures. Place the items in a bin or basket for your child to explore. This activity will help your child develop their sense of touch and sight.



Did a new online friend ask for money?

Odds are it's a scam

Social media can be a great way to connect with new friends, but it's a different story when someone approaches you to be friends and then asks for money. That's no friend, that's a scammer.

Scammers create fake profiles and pretend to be someone they're not, maybe a businessperson, servicemember, or member of an international organization, with profile details that seems to support their story. They try to become your friend, and as you start trusting them, they have explanations for why they can't meet in person. And then, eventually, they ask you for money, maybe to finally travel to see you or to help them out of a crisis.

When they ask for money, these scammers will often tell you how to send it. People report that scammers told them to wire money through a company like Western Union or MoneyGram, send the numbers on gift cards, use a payment app, or send cryptocurrency.

If you think someone you met on social media is a scammer, cut ties. Tell the social media platform, and then tell the FTC at [ReportFraud.ftc.gov](https://www.ftc.gov/complaint).

If you're ever in a situation like this:

- Talk to your friends or family about your new online relationship. See what they say about the person.
- Search online for information about this person and their story, plus the word "scammer." Have other people posted similar stories?
- Do a reverse image search of the person's profile picture. Is it associated with another name or with details that don't match up?
- Don't send money to someone you've never met in person. If that person asks for money, no matter how friendly the online relationship seems, it's probably a scam.
