

Gift Ideas for Infants and Toddlers

The holidays are right around the corner! Here are some gift ideas that can help with different areas of your child's development. These items encourage imaginative play, understanding of words, using sounds and words, the use of big and little muscles, and problem-solving skills. We recommend that you purchase toys with bright and contrasting colors. These are easier for babies to see and track. We also recommend that you purchase toys that do not make noise. This encourages children to produce their own sounds and words while playing. Make sure to check the recommended age range for each of these items.

Thank you to all who attended and contributed to the warm, fun atmosphere. We look forward to our next Cook Night and another opportunity to learn and enjoy good food as a group!






Halloween Dance Party
