### What You Need to Know About House Bill 144 "Keith's Law"

House Bill 144 – now known as "Keith's Law" is a new Ohio law that went into effect January 19, 2026. It expands and improves Ohio's Communication Disability Database so that any person with a disability can choose to include useful information that helps first responders (law enforcement, EMTs, firefighters) understand how best to assist them during emergencies.

Under this law:

A voluntary statewide database is available where individuals with disabilities can share important information, such as communication challenges or other needs, ahead of time.

Information submitted to the database will be accessible to each county 9-1-1 system and through the Law Enforcement Automated Data System (LEADS), so responders have helpful context before arriving on scene.

The Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities Agency and the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities will provide and publicize the verification form people use to register.

Participation in the database is optional, and the form lets you decide what information you choose to share.

Why It Matters:

By giving first responders advanced awareness of communication or other support needs, Keith's Law helps build safer, more informed emergency responses and reduces misunderstandings in stressful situations.

## OHIO'S BLUE ENVELOPE PROGRAM

A **communication tool** to assist individuals with **developmental disabilities** during interactions with law enforcement and emergency personnel. Ask one of our personnel to receive your packet.



**FREE Blue Envelope Packet include:**

- Blue Envelope** – Keep important documents needed for traffic stops together in one place
- Blue Envelope Car Decal** – Tells law enforcement or first responders that someone in vehicle has a disability
- Wallet Card** – Carry with you to provide information quickly in emergencies
- Program Brochure** – Explains how to use items in the Blue Envelope packet


