Finding Strength in the Struggle

Local Author Brooke Ward Shares Her Story During Spinal Cord Injury Awareness Month

September is Spinal Cord Injury Awareness Month, and HOPE Services is proud to highlight an inspiring local voice — Brooke Ward, an author, advocate, and Napoleon resident who is using her story to spread awareness, hope, and strength.

At just 15 years old, Brooke's life changed forever after an alcohol-related car accident left her a C4 quadriplegic. Doctors gave her less than a year to live. Twenty-one years later, Brooke is thriving — and now she's sharing her journey in her memoir, *If It Ain't Brooke, Don't Fix It*.

"I don't want to be 'fixed.' This is who I am. This is my story."

A Book Born from Resilience

The idea for Brooke's memoir started with journaling on her phone. A friend encouraged her to turn her words into something bigger. "It's my life — the ups, the downs, the realness," Brooke said. "It's about injury, but also family, parenting, addiction, loss — really, just life. If it helps even one person, it's worth it."



Breaking Misconceptions

Brooke hopes to challenge common misunderstandings about spinal cord injuries.

"One of the biggest misconceptions is that we're all the same. But every person with a spinal cord injury has a unique story. We're not a diagnosis — we're individuals."

She also emphasizes the importance of community support and education: "Educate yourself. Advocate. Volunteer. Be kind. You never know when something like this could touch your life or someone you love."

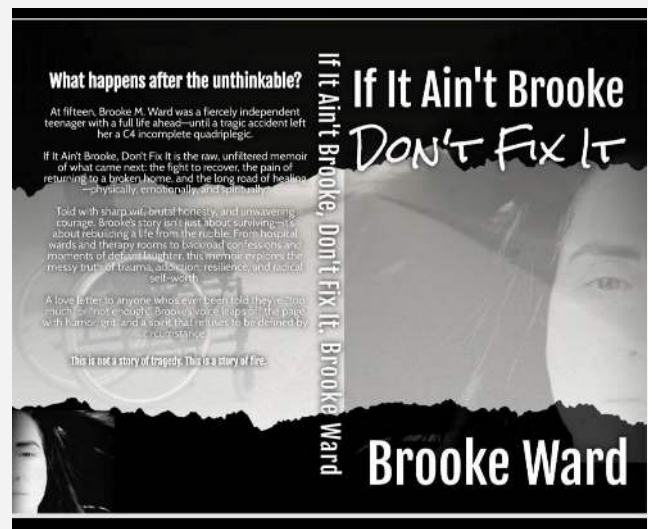
When asked what message she would share with others living with SCI, Brooke offered heartfelt encouragement:

World Lymphoma Awareness Day

World Lymphoma Awareness Day on September 15 is dedicated to informing the public about cancers of the lymphatic system.

The lymphatic system is made up of a vast network of vessels, branching out into every tissue of our body. They contain a colorless fluid called Lymph. This intricate system of fluid and vessels act as a transport system carrying lymphocytes. These specialized white blood cells fight infection.

When lymphoma develops, it attacks the lymphocytes making it difficult for our bodies to fight infection. These cells are found throughout our body, not just our lymph nodes. Lymph nodes live in our bone marrow, spleen and our blood.

There are over 30 types of lymphoma with two main subtypes - Hodgkins lymphoma and non-Hodgkins lymphoma.

Symptoms include:

- *lymph node swelling
- *fatigue that persists
- *night sweats
- *fever
- *difficulty catching breath
- *unexplained weight loss

According to the National Institute of Health, in the United States in 2019, an estimated 74,200 new cases of non-Hodgkins lymphoma was reported. Of all new cancer cases reported, non-Hodgkins lymphoma accounts for 4.2%.

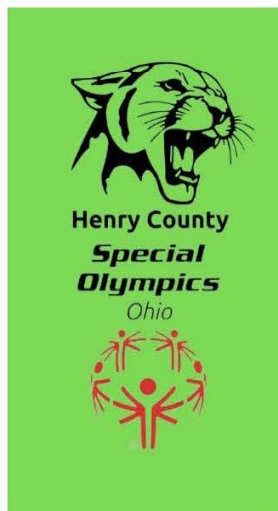

Voices of HOPE Attends NW OSDA Training

On Tuesday, August 26, 2025, members of Voices of HOPE had the opportunity to attend the Northwest OSDA Training at Tiffin University, alongside advocates and leaders from across the region. This day of learning and connection brought together people passionate about advocacy, leadership, and building stronger communities for individuals with developmental disabilities.

Morning Session: Hearts in Aktion – Service and Sun Safety

The morning presentation, led by Dick Brulotte, Ohio District Kiwanis Aktion Club Administrator, along with Keesha Hiser and Corinna Feasel from the Seneca County General Health District, focused on “Hearts in Aktion: Service and Sun Safety.” Attendees learned about the positive impact Aktion Clubs have in communities while also gaining valuable education on sun protection and prevention.

Afternoon Session: Positive Interactions with Law Enforcement

In the afternoon, Lea Perrine, Investigative Agent with Sandusky County Board of Developmental Disabilities, shared strategies and resources for promoting positive interactions between individuals served and law enforcement. Her session emphasized safety, respect, and building strong relationships between self-advocates and first responders.
